Message Title: God is For You

Key Text: Romans 8:31-39

Discussion Guide

Main Idea

This week, Pastor Mark Pettus concluded the Romans 8 series with a powerful Easter message from Romans 8:31-39, focusing on the victory we have in Christ. Paul brings clarity to one of life's most important questions: What is God like? His answer is simple, yet it changes everything. **God is for us!** Through the sacrifice of Jesus, we see the ultimate proof of God's love for us.

Pastor Mark emphasized that because God is for us, no sin is too great, no shame is too deep, and no situation is too far gone for His love. Through Christ's death and resurrection, we are justified, freed from condemnation, and empowered to love as more than conquerors. Even in the face of hardship, we can live with confidence knowing nothing can separate us from God's love.

Pastor Mark invites us to move from curiosity into conviction, to live fully convinced that God is for us. As we respond, we take next steps to Know God, Find Freedom, Discover Purpose, and Make a Difference. Easter reminds us that through the crown of thorns, the cross, and the empty tomb, we walk in victory and unshakeable love.

Make It Practical

1. Prayerfully read Romans 8:31-39 several times. Take a few quiet moments to listen for what God the Father may be speaking to you through His Word. Write down any thoughts, encouragements, or truths He is revealing to you.
2. Is there an area of sin in your life that you've struggled to fully surrender to God? How can you intentionally bring that to Him this week and receive His forgiveness?
3. What labels or shame have you been carrying that do not align with what God says about you? Take time to identify those and replace them with the truth of who you are in Christ.
4. What situation in your life feels overwhelming or difficult right now? How can you invite God into that situation and trust Him as your source of victory this week?

Talk About It

1. What stood out to you most from this message, and why do you think it impacted you?
2. A. W. Tozer said, “What comes into our minds when we think about God is the most important thing about us.” What is the first thing that comes to your mind when you think about God?
3. Paul says we are “more than conquerors.” What do you think that looks like in everyday life?
4. Paul says he is “convinced” that nothing can separate us from God’s love. What would it look like for you to live with that same confidence this week, and what step can you take to move in that direction?
