Message Title: How to Build Healthy Community

Key Text: John 13:1-5

Discussion Guide

Main Idea

This week, Pastor Caleb Chambers concluded Part 4 of the *Let's Talk About It* series by teaching on how to build healthy community. In a world more connected than ever, many people still feel deeply alone. We may have more followers, group chats, and online interaction, but true community cannot be built through proximity alone. Jesus modeled a different way of living—one marked by serving, encouraging, producing, protecting, and praying for one another.

On the night before the cross, Jesus spent His final moments focusing on relationships and the Holy Spirit. Instead of promoting Himself or protecting His status, He knelt down and washed His disciples' feet (John 13:1-5). Jesus showed us that healthy community is built through humility and sacrificial love. Community is not a bonus feature of faith; it is evidence of it.

Pastor Caleb taught that healthy community is built when we serve one another, encourage one another daily, produce together, protect each other spiritually, and pray for one another honestly and consistently. Scripture reminds us that we were never designed to do life alone. God created us for connection, purpose, and belonging within the body of Christ.

The best version of your life does not happen in isolation. Separate we struggle, but together we win.

Make It Practical

1. Prayerfully read through John 13:1-17 this week. What stands out to you about the way Jesus treated his disciples?
2. Who in your life may need encouragement right now? What is one intentional way you can support them this week?
3. Jesus modeled serving others without seeking recognition. What is one way you can serve someone quietly this week?

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“Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another’s feet. I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you.”

Talk About It

1. What’s a moment when someone showed up for you in a way you’ll never forget?
2. Who is someone in your life that makes you feel encouraged, refreshed, and stronger after being around them?
3. Jesus washed His disciples’ feet the night before the cross. What does that moment teach us about what real love and friendship look like?
4. Pastor Caleb said, “The best version of your life doesn’t happen in isolation.” Where have you seen community make life better, stronger, or more meaningful?

Help us to serve others selflessly, encourage people daily, and build relationships that honor You.
